**MANDATORY WATER CONSERVATION
MEASURES- EFFECTIVE 1 JULY2009**

The combination of below –average rainfall over the past 3 Years, and problems with reliability of imported water supplies, has created a water shortage in the San Diego Water Authority (SDCWA), of which Camp Pendleton is a member agency, has declared a “ Drought Alert” for the 2009 water year. This Declaration means that water providers in San Diego County MUST reduce their water usage through mandatory water conservation measures.

Camp Pendleton is a Federal Agency with its own internal water supply and it’s not otherwise legally required to comply with state/regional water conservation mandates. However, as a matter of public policy, and where deemed appropriate, Camp Pendleton will implement mandatory conservation measures that commensurate with those restrictions implemented in surrounding communities.

This Basegram is effective until rescinded.

LAKE O'NEIL EFMP PLAYGROUND

All Access Playground

Children and adults with mobility and other physical challenges not able to access most community playgrounds due to the materials used for the footings such as sand and the areas that have some access are limited in the variety of equipment. Additionally, equipment in a typical playground does not support interaction with children by adults with mobility issues such as those using a walker or a prosthetic limb. No existing 'rallying' point for families with special needs to come together and enjoy family time in the outdoors in a common setting. Limited use of current facilities for such things as accessible picnic tables and shaded play areas create.

Access parenting videos and written materials

The Resource & Referral Office is located in room 121 in Bldg 13150. Hours of operation are 0700-1730 Monday to Friday (760) 725-9723.

FCC also provides employment opportunities for spouses living aboard the installation. Individuals can be trained and certified to become Family Child Care Providers.

Autism Support Group

This group is designed for parents that have a child diagnosed on the autism spectrum and/or a related disorder. It is a structured group featuring guest speakers, question & answer time, What's working? discussion and moral support. It is intended to support and educate parents on different strategies, programs and techniques specific to autism spectrum disorders and similar disabilities. The group will meet the third Wednesday of every month from 6:30 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. at the DeLuz Housing Community Center.

Sponsored Visitor Program

Due to increased security concerns and to better protect the Camp Pendleton community, Camp Pendleton will implement the sponsored visitor program (SVP) The SVP is for social visitors and officially designated volunteers, and simply replaces paper visitor passes with electronic databases. Visitors will present their driver license to the sentry at an installation access control point (gate) and identify who they are going to visit. The sentry will scan the driver's license and the scan will record the drivers name and license number along with the date, time, and location of entry. An instant background check through open public sources is also conducted.

Frequent visitors and official volunteers requiring access more than 3X in any 45-day period will require a Camp Pendleton sponsor to complete a visitor sponsorship form (VSF). VSF can be obtained and submitted at all gates and the Provost Marshall Office. VSF's allow an authorized person or organization to sponsor an individual for specified period of time up to 90 days. Once the visitor info is input into the SVP, The visitor will be allowed access during the sponsored dates simply by having their driver's license or state ID card scanned upon entry. Once that time expires or is revoked, the visitor will be not be allowed access until such time as another VSF is submitted and approved.

The Sponsored Visitor Program is for social visitors and officially designated volunteers ONLY, and not for anyone conducting business or employment aboard Camp Pendleton. Those people conducting any kind of business on Camp Pendleton must apply for a Camp Pendleton business pass or a Rapid Gate Business Pass.

MAAC Project Head Start & Early Head Start

MAAC Project Headstart is a bilingual/multicultural, early childhood and family education program funded by the Federal Government. Services are provided in Camp Pendleton, Oceanside, Vista, San Marcos, Fallbrook, and Valley Center. Children are served in our Center Base, Home Base, Early Head Start, Family Child Care (FCCP).

Who Is eligible for Head Start?

Children who are low-income and children with moderate to severe disabilities between the ages 0 to 5 years and prenatal woman are eligible. Age and Federal Government income guidelines determine who qualifies.

What do I need to Register my child?

- Birth Certificate
- Immunization Card (Up to Date)
- Current LES/ or 4 Recent pay stubs

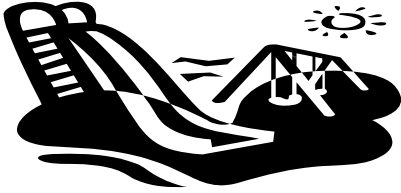

Once a child or guest of a resident is identified, that resident will be charged for replacement parts and labor. POOL RULES

- All patrons must follow ALL pool rules
- All patrons must wear appropriate swimwear(swim suits, swim trunks & rash guards only)
- All patrons must follow Lifeguard Instructions
- All patrons must rinse off before entering pool
- No patrons under the age of 16 will be permitted to enter pool area w/out a Parent/Guardian over 18
- No smoking in pool area
- No diapers allowed in pool & no diapering on pool deck
- No jumping, diving, pushing or pulling of others into the pool.
- Any patron that has had a SMALL POX Vaccine in the last 30 days is not allowed in the pool.

CAMP PENDLETON RECYCLING PROGRAM

Recycling is a component of Camp Pendleton's solid waste management program and its primary function is to reduce the volume of waste disposed into the Base Landfills and to meet Federal, state, and local requirements.

All homes are provided recycling bins for curbside collection. Aluminum & metal cans, plastic & glass bottles, jugs and jars can be commingled and placed into the same container. EMERGENCY NOTIFICATIONS

Sign up now for Emergency Notification Alerts provided free of charge by the Commanding Officer, Marine Corps Base, Camp Pendleton. These alerts will notify you if there is an emergency aboard the base and will provide guidance as to the actions you should take. Recent experience with this system has proven that it can save lives by providing communication directly to you in a timely manner during an emergency.

To sign up simply complete the following instructions:

1. Go to: http://entry.inspironlogistics.com/camp_pendletonlwens.cfm
2. Fill out the form provided. The following information is the minimum requirement:

-Last Name -Address or Barracks # -Phone Number:

-Select One Phone Number to Receive the Notification via a Voice Message if so desired. If not selected all notifications will be via text or email. -Multiple phone numbers are allowed (Home, Work, and Cell Phone).

-Email Address: Multiple Addresses allowed

-Housing or Barracks Area (Selected from the Pull Down Menu)

3. Click on the "Sign up Now" button.

If there is an emergency you will receive a text message and an email concerning the event along with regular updates (approx 10 would be sent during an emergency). During non-Emergency periods you can expect to receive one text message and email a month for system tests

NOTE: This is a free service provided by Marine Corps Base, Camp Pendleton; however, normal text message fees from your carrier may apply. To receive text messages, your cell phone must have text messaging capabilities. During an actual emergency you may also receive a voice message on your home and cell phone.

* The information provided for this service will never be used for any purpose other than emergency notifications.
** Each message you receive will have an unsubscribe link should you wish to discontinue this service.



Energy Conservation Measures

Checklist

Lights:

- ✓ Turn off lights in un-occupied areas
- ✓ Turn off interior lights when day lighting is sufficient
- ✓ Ensure that light levels in work area does not exceed requirement for task
- ✓ Replace light bulbs
- ✓ Reduce light levels in corridors, stairwells, hallways, etc.
- ✓ Reduce excessive wattage in work areas
- ✓ Turn off all exterior lights during the day
- ✓ Insure that stacks of supplies or equipment do not block lights
- ✓ Reduce excessive exterior illumination
- ✓ Insure that all de-lamped fluorescent lamps have their ballast removed
- ✓ Keep light fixtures and reflective surfaces clean
- ✓ Keep interior walls and windows clean to maximize their reflectivity

Electrical Equipment

- ✓ Turn off all electrical equipment when not in use

AIR CONDITIONING

Turn off the air conditioning or set the thermostat up a few degrees when you leave home.

When air conditioning is on, keep doors and windows closed.

Turn off kitchen or bathroom exhaust fans when your air conditioning is operating.

Change your air filter once a month.

SPEED LIMIT 15 MPH

We ask that all residents be courteous to all pedestrian's as well as abide by all housing traffic rules. Remember 15 MPH is the speed limit in any housing area, come to a complete stop at all STOP signs and pedestrians in cross walks always have the right of way.
